


Krista M. Lindquist '99



Krista Lindquist graduated from North Yarmouth Academy in 1999 and went on to attend Mount Holyoke College in South Hadley, Massachusetts, graduating in 2003. A dedicated student athlete, Krista was inducted into the Cum Laude Society, NYA's academic honor society, in her junior year. She continued her academic success at Mount Holyoke, where she graduated Cum Laude, and from there attended the University of Tennessee, College of Veterinary Medicine. Today, Krista is a large animal veterinarian with a practice located in the Lakes Region area of Maine.

While her academic success is very impressive, her athletic accomplishments are equally commendable. As a student at NYA, Krista played both field hockey and basketball at the varsity level. In field hockey, she was a four year letter winner, and served as team captain her senior year. She was selected to the Maine All State Team her senior year, in addition to being a two time Western Maine Conference selection. In basketball, Krista was a four year letter winner and a two year captain. She was twice named a first team Western Maine Conference selection and twice named to the Western Maine All-Tournament Team. As a junior, Krista earned the NYA Athletic Council Award, and in her senior year was named a Western Maine Senior All Star. Even the local news

caught on to her success, and she was selected for Bruce Glasier's Varsity Club and also a Channel 13 Varsity Student Athlete.

At Mount Holyoke, Krista played one year of basketball and then focused her athletic attention on field hockey. Elected a captain her senior year, Krista earned many awards and recognitions for her performance at the college level. She was named to the NEWMAC All Conference Team her freshman, sophomore, and senior years, and to the Seven Sisters All Tournament Team her sophomore, junior, and senior years. Krista was also named to the New England Regional All American 2nd Team her senior year.

Under Krista's leadership on the field, Mount Holyoke became the Seven Sisters Tournament Champions in 2002, the NEWMAC Conference Champions in 2001 for the first time in school history, and the ECAC Tournament Champions in 2002 for the first time in school history. When she was a sophomore, Mount Holyoke qualified for the NCAA Division III Women's Field Hockey Championship for the first time in school's history.

Krista holds many records and awards in field hockey at Mount Holyoke, including being named the Mount Holyoke College Impact Player of the Year her sophomore and senior years. She currently holds the record at Mount Holyoke for the most career goals (60), the most total points in a career (143), and most points in a season (47). Krista was also recognized for her academic accomplishments, as a three time member of the National Field Hockey Coaches Association National Academic Squad, a four year member of the NEWMAC Academic All Conference Team, selected to represent Mount Holyoke at the NCAA Foundation Leadership Conference as a senior, and the winner of the Mount Holyoke College Scholar Athlete Award, an award given to one recipient representing all sports, her senior year. Krista's ability to balance academics and athletics, and at such a high level, has been a testament to her strong work ethic, both on and off the playing field.
