


## Jonathan P. Thompson '99



Jonathan P. Thompson graduated from NYA in 1999 and was a member of the boys soccer, ice hockey, and lacrosse teams. After graduating from NYA, Jon went on to play college lacrosse at Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. He has recently become head coach of the Colby College men's lacrosse team. A tenacious competitor and leader, Jon was a senior captain in both soccer and ice hockey, and was named a Senior All Star in ice hockey. Jon's best sport, however, was lacrosse.

As a freshman at NYA, Jon made an immediate impact on the lacrosse team, leading the squad in both points and goals. During his sophomore year, he continued his impressive play, once again leading the team in points and goals. That same year, Jon not only led his team in goals, he was also first in the state in scoring and earned First Team All State recognition. In his junior year, Jon was elected captain of the lacrosse team, again was first on the team and became first in the state in scoring, and earned All-American honors. As a senior, Jon was again elected captain, and again earned All-American honors. He was also named a Senior All Star, First Team All State, and was selected as the Maine Sunday Telegram Player of the Year. He continued to build on his impressive stats, again leading the team in scoring, with 64 goals and 46 assists for 110 points his senior year. Jon finished his career

with a state record 277 goals and 154 assists for a staggering 431 points in his high school career.

During his career at Brown University, he brought his intense competitiveness and ability to score to Division I men's lacrosse. He was a two time captain, and three time offensive MVP, finishing his career with 94 goals and 43 assists for a total of 137 points. Jon is 15th in the Brown record book in points, and 9th in scoring. In his senior year at Brown, Jon was a USILA Honorable Mention All-American, and an Academic All-American, in addition to being a two time All-Ivy and All-New England player.

After graduating from Brown in 2003, Jon coached at Brown and played briefly for the Boston Cannons of Major League Lacrosse. He then became the offensive coordinator at Springfield College before returning to Brown as an assistant coach and was named the head men's lacrosse coach at Colby College in 2009. This year, Jon coached the Mules to their first NESCAC tournament appearance since 2002 and their first winning record since 2004.

The definition of intensity and passion for the game, Jon has guided and inspired dozens of young players to compete and excel in lacrosse. North Yarmouth Academy is honored to induct Jonathan Thompson into the inaugural class of the Edgar F. White '38 Athletic Hall of Fame.
